

Environmental Campground Registration, Rules & Regulations

Hood Mountain Regional Park

Welcome to the Hood Mountain Environmental Campground. The campground rules are designed for your safety and the protection of this unique environment. Remember to respect fellow campers as well as the land. Please be considerate of our park neighbors and nearby private properties. We also ask that you leave the park cleaner than you found it. "Enjoy responsibly, camp respectfully and create memories."

Registration

- Campers with reservations for the environmental campground must register at Spring Lake Park's Newanga entry station between 11 am and 3 pm (no more than 48 hours in advance of their reservation arrival date). The camper must provide park staff with each vehicle's license plate number **at time of registration**. For questions, contact park staff at (707) 539-8092.
- Camping fee includes one (1) vehicle per environmental campsite. One additional vehicle will be allowed per environmental campsite and the additional vehicle fee will apply.
- Parking is valid at the Pythian Road parking lot only. No overnight parking allowed at the Los Alamos Road parking lot.
- Be sure to make your site look occupied at all times. Do not leave anything of value unattended.

Rules & Regulations

- Check in time is 2 pm; check out is 12 pm.
- Campsites are tent only. Tents must be pitched in designated area only.
- Dogs or animals of any kind are not permitted.
- A maximum of four (4) people are allowed at each environmental campsite (at anytime; includes children).
- Pit/chemical toilet located nearby.
- There is **NO** potable water available; bring your own drinking/cooking water.
- No trash services available. Pack out everything you bring in. The registered camper will be liable for any clean up or damage of any kind.
- Camp stoves are permitted for cooking. Campfires, cooking fires and BBQ's are **NOT** allowed. Hood Mountain Regional Park is a non-smoking facility.
- Digging, trenching, disturbing the ground, etc. is not allowed.
- Campers must remain within the designated campground area after sunset. Day use areas of the park close at sunset.
- Environmental campers are permitted to stay at Hood Mountain Park up to four (4) consecutive nights with a maximum of 30 nights in a calendar year.
- Campers may be able to change their campsite or add nights after arriving at the park. Check with park staff about possible changes.
- A partial refund of camping fees may be available subject to the approval of the Supervising Ranger. Campers must notify park staff of early departure prior to leaving the park.

Failure to comply with policies, rules and regulations may result in eviction from the campground and/or a loss of paid fees. It is the responsibility of the reservation holder to make sure that all members of their camping party are informed of and comply with all rules and policies. The undersigned and their party agree to all rules and regulations.
