Title:

Consolidated Fee Hearing - Regional Parks Fee Package FY 24-25

Recommended Action:

- A. Approval of Resolution of the Board of Supervisors authorizing fee adjustments for various fees supporting camping, group use reservations, special events and activities, park operations, community engagement programs, and residence maintenance fees.
- B. Review and approval of new fees including seasonal parking fees, summer camps fees, and new synthetic turf field use rates.
- C. Review and approval of the removal of obsolete fees that include specific facility rentals and community engagement programs no longer being offered to the public.

Executive Summary:

Sonoma County manages 58 parks, trails, beaches, and other facilities covering more than 16,237 acres. In FY 23-24, fees paid by park visitors provided 29% of the Regional Parks operating budget. Fee revenue is critical in operating and maintain the growing system of parks for residents and visitors.

This year, Regional Parks has completed a comprehensive review of their current approved fees. Many of the fees have not been adjusted since their inception, most over 10 years. Regional Parks proposes changes to its fees to recover reasonable costs of maintaining park services provided for public use. The Department's internal review also provided an opportunity to recommend new fees in response to changes and needs in programs and with recommendations for the deletion of fees that are now obsolete. Details are included in the Fee Package Adjustment document and Resolution accompanying this report.

Discussion:

Changes to Current Fees and Rates

Regional Parks staff recommends, in most instances, up to a 4% increase to the following fees for FY 24-25.

- Day use parking for vehicles with 10+ passengers
- Group picnic reservations for up to 99 guests; over 100 guests
- Non-commercial/non-profit events (1-7 days) for 25-99 guests; 100-199 guests; 200-299 guests; over 300 guests
- Non-commercial/non-profit events (1 wk.-1 yr.) for 25-99 guests; 100-199 guests; 200-299 guests; over

300 guests

- Non-league athletic field use (1-7 days) for 25-99 guests; 100-199 guests; 200-299 guests; over 300 guests
- Non-league athletic field use (1 wk.-1 yr.) for 25-99 guests; 100-199 guests; 200-299 guests; over 300 guests
- Still Film/Photo permit fees for 5 vehicles with up to 8 people; 6-8 vehicles with up to 15 people; 9-15 vehicles and no more than 25 people; 16 or more vehicles and no more than 90 people
- Motion Picture photography fees for up to 5 vehicles with no more than 10 people; 11-15 vehicles and no more than 25 people; 16 to 20 vehicles and no more than 50 people; 21-25 vehicles with no more than 100 people; 25 or more vehicles and no more than 150 people
- Tolay/Environmental Discovery Center field trip fees resident/non-resident
- Tolay/Environmental Discovery Center Outreach Program fees resident/non-resident
- Tolay Lake Education Program fees resident/non-resident
- Athletic Facilities permit for organized adult and youth non-profit leagues, 12-wk. or less
- Individual camping (peak) individual, individual resident, individual access

- Environmental campsites (peak)
- Environmental campsites
- Group camping max 75 people
- Group camping vehicle fee, extra vehicles per night
- Electrical service, selected campsites
- Dump station fee
- Camping sites additional vehicle fee, per night
- Major events special use permits
- Minor commercial events with and without set schedules
- Minor commercial events, commercial guides
- Summer Camp fees
- Summer Camp transportation fee
- Special Use permit fee, enhanced special events

Justification for Changes to Current Fees:

The proposed fee increases reflect the reasonable costs of maintaining the parks for public use and recovering costs the services provided. The attached Fee Package Adjustment document details that most of the fees recommended for increases have not been increased since their inceptions ten or more years ago. Many of the fees are service oriented, where Department staff performs daily services - environmental education, custodial and maintenance for field, campground, event coordination, and recreation use. Over the past several years, there have been negotiated increases to salary and benefit costs, many in the 3-4% range, but the Department's fees for services have remained unchanged. The Department is recommending, in most instances, up to a 4% increase to the fees listed in this report, and nearly three-quarters of increases are less than 10%. There are some fees recommended where a flat rate increase is proposed and the percentage increase exceeds 4%. These fees typically are for larger, more labor-intensive services such as large group picnic events, large group educational programs, and multi-week field use events.

These types of events typically utilize 2-3 employees for set up and clean up along with additional waste services and a larger percentage (25-40%) increase is recommended.

Larger percentage increases are also being recommended for services where the Department experiences increased costs for utilities or vendors who have increased rates. The annual cost for electrical services, water, sanitation, and waste disposal have all increased. For electrical service, 2%-6% over the last three years, and 31%-39% over the last three years for waste services. Increasing fees for electrical hook-ups at selected campsites and sewer dump station fees helps offset the costs for providing the service.

Lastly, some increases are being recommended for vehicle allowance for large group events and for group camping. Additional vehicles are typically on site for 24-hour periods and are utilizing parking spaces that would otherwise be available to other day use park visitors, thus limiting parking and revenue the Department would receive from several vehicles utilizing a single spot while visiting that day.

New Proposed Fees

River Park Seasonal Day Use Parking: The Department is also recommending a Seasonal Day Use Parking fee of \$10 from Memorial Day to Labor Day in locations that are impacted during peak season at specific parks: Healdsburg Veterans Memorial Beach, Riverfront Regional Park, Del Rio Woods, Cloverdale River Park, Sunset Beach River Park, and Guerneville River Park. For the remaining portion of the year outside of Memorial Day to Labor Day, the general parking fee of \$7 will remain the same.

Synthetic Turf Field Use: The Department has recently installed 2 new synthetic turf fields at Maxwell Farms Regional Park and has developed field use prioritization and fees for the use of those fields in FY24-25. Group A is for Local Non-Profits, Group B is for Sonoma County residents, Group C is for non-residents and Group D is for Commercial (for-profit) events. Hourly fee information and similar agency fees are show below.

Summer Camp: The Community Engagement Division is recommending adding a new series of Recreation/Discovery/Environmental camps. The fee recommended for these camps is \$350 per session.

Justification for New Fees:

With the implementation of a new low-cost (\$5 per person) Russian River shuttle service, the Department is recommending an increased River Park Seasonal Day Use Parking fee to encourage visitors to park offsite and provide additional options for river access where parking is limited, particularly during the summer months. The fee for parking during this period will increase to \$10 daily at the following parks, Healdsburg Veterans Memorial Beach, Riverfront Regional Park, Del Rio Woods, Cloverdale River Park, Sunset Beach River Park, and Guerneville River Park and will be used to offset the additional staffing for river patrols and lifeguards at these locations during these busy months.

The Department currently offers a variety of Summer Camps primarily focused on aquatics. The recommended

new camps would be recreation and environmental focused aimed at reaching another audience. The courses will offer another camp option to the public who are looking for summer programs for their children.

Deletion of Fees

The Department is recommending the following fees be deleted due to them no longer being offered as a service.

- Kenwood Gazebo Special Use Permit
- Gualala Visitors Center rental
- Youth Birthday Parties basic package and deluxe packages, additional children fees
- Group Camping, max 50 people
- Park Program Fees Tier 1 general and member, Tier 2 general and member, Tier 3 general and member and Tier 4 general and member
- Professional Development Seminars

Justification for the Deletion of Fees

Both the Kenwood Gazebo and Gualala Visitors Center were listed as separate physical sites for rental. The Department would remove them from the fee schedule and rent them as we would any other park location based on proposed attendance.

The Youth Birthday party packages were developed as a fee item many years ago. The Community Engagement Division is focusing on providing educational classes and opportunities and recommends deleting these fees.

Park Program Fees by Tiers program was developed many years ago and is no longer being offered. The program was replaced with a new sliding fee that was implemented in July 2011.

Professional Development seminars on Pest Management are no longer being offered by the Divisions.

Summary of Expected Results:

This year, the Department did not propose fee increases to the annual parks pass - general, senior, access or vehicle entry passes. Fees being proposed in this report are only being added to cover ongoing increases or the costs of providing staff services for programs, maintenance and care of facilities and events. While partial cost recovery is the key driver necessitating increases to park fees, Regional Parks seeks to ensure that its fees are not prohibitive to users even at the expense of cost recovery.

Fee revenue shown is an estimate of revenue based on the increased fees and reflect the reasonable cost of operating park facilities, supporting community events and activities, educational opportunities, and services. Where possible, the Department has recommended a 4% increase to the fees shown in this report. In most cases, fees have not been adjusted since their inception with many fees not seeing an increase in 10+ years. While partial cost recovery is the key driver necessitating increases to park fees, Regional Parks seeks to ensure that its fees are not prohibitive to users even at the expense of cost recovery.

Whereas, the County of Sonoma owns and operates fifty-eight Regional Parks, trails, and other facilities: and

Whereas, it is in the best interests of the County of Sonoma and the general public to maintain and operate said facilities at a standard of care that provides for the welfare, safety and enjoyment of park visitors;

Whereas, adjustments to camping, group use reservations, special events and activities, park operations, community engagement programs, and residence maintenance fees will increase revenue so the General Fund does not have to be used to pay for these services provided to the fee payors; and

Whereas, Regional Parks has reviewed obsolete fees no longer in use for the public and recommends removal of specific facility rentals and Community Engagement programs; and

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that to recover the reasonable cost of providing certain parks services, it is necessary to increase certain fees and establish certain new fees as set forth

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below:

Recommended Action:

- A. Approval of Resolution of the Board of Supervisors and the Directors of the Sonoma Water Agency authorizing fee adjustments for various fees supporting camping, group use reservations, special events and activities, park operations, community engagement programs, and residence maintenance fees.
- B. Review and approval of new fees for additional summer camp offerings, and additional new rates for Spring Lake waterpark use.
- C. Review and approval of the removal of obsolete fees for community engagement programs no longer being offered to the public.

Executive Summary:

Sonoma County manages 58 parks, trails, beaches, and other facilities covering more than 16,237 acres. In FY 23-24, fees paid by park visitors provided 29% of the Regional Parks operating budget. Fee revenue is critical in operating and maintain the growing system of parks for residents and visitors.

This year, Regional Parks has completed a comprehensive review of the current approved fees for Spring Lake Park. Many of the fees have not been adjusted since their inception, most over 10 years. Regional Parks proposes changes to its fees to recover reasonable costs of maintaining park services provided for public use. The Department's internal review also provided an opportunity to recommend new fees in response to changes and needs in programs and with recommendations for the deletion of fees that are now obsolete. Details are included in the Fee Package Adjustment document and Resolution accompanying this report.

Discussion:

Changes to Current Fees and Rates

Regional Parks propose increases and changes to the following fees for FY 24-25.

- Day use parking for vehicles with 10+ passengers
- Group picnic reservations for up to 99 guests; over 100 guests
- Non-commercial/non-profit events (1-7 days) for 25-99 guests; 100-199 guests; 200-299 guests; over 300 guests

- Non-commercial/non-profit events (1 wk.-1 yr.) for 25-99 guests; 100-199 guests; 200-299 guests; over 300 guests
- Still Film/Photo permit fees for 5 vehicles with up to 8 people; 6-8 vehicles with up to 15 people; 9-15 vehicles and no more than 25 people; 16 or more vehicles and no more than 90 people
- Motion Picture photography fees for up to 5 vehicles with no more than 10 people; 11-15 vehicles and no more than 25 people; 16 to 20 vehicles and no more than 50 people; 21-25 vehicles with no more than 100 people; 25 or more vehicles and no more than 150 people
- Tolay/Environmental Discovery Center field trip fees resident/non-resident
- Tolay/Environmental Discovery Center Outreach Program fees resident/non-resident
- Individual camping (peak) individual, individual resident, individual access
- Individual camping individual, individual resident, individual access
- Group camping max 75 people
- Group camping vehicle fee, extra vehicles per night
- Electrical service, selected campsites
- Dump station fee
- Camping sites additional vehicle fee, per night
- Major events special use permits
- Minor commercial events with and without set schedules
- Minor commercial events, commercial guides
- Summer Camp fees
- Summer Camp transportation fee
- Special Use permit fee, enhanced special events
- Resident Maintenance fee
- Spring Lake Water Park use reservation fee, up to 25 people
- Spring Lake Water Park season pass
- Trainings provided for partner agencies
- Spring Lake cabin fees peak Sun-Thurs, peak Fri-Sun, peak holidays

Justification for Changes to Current Fees:

The proposed fee increases reflect the reasonable costs of maintaining the parks for public use and recovering costs the services provided. The attached Fee Package Adjustment document details that most of the fees recommended for increases have not been increased since their inceptions ten or more years ago. Many of the fees are service oriented, where Department staff performs daily services - environmental education, custodial and maintenance for field, campground, event coordination, and recreation use. Over the past several years, there have been negotiated increases to salary and benefit costs, many in the 3-4% range but the Department fees for services has remained unchanged. The Department is recommending, in most instances, up to a 4% increase to the fees listed in this report.

There are some fees recommended where a flat rate increase is proposed and the percentage increase exceeds 4%. These fees typically are for larger, more labor-intensive services such as large group picnic events, large group educational programs, and multi-week field use events. These types of events typically utilize 2-3 employees for set up and clean up along with additional waste services and a larger percentage (25-40%) increase is recommended.

Larger percentage increases are also being recommended for services where the Department experiences

increased costs for a utilities or vendors who have increased rates. The annual cost for electrical services, water, sanitation, and waste disposal has increased 2%-6% over the last three years for electricity and 31%-39% over the last three years for waste services. Increasing fees for electrical hook-ups at selected campsites and sewer dump station fees helps offset the costs for providing the service.

Lastly, some increases are being recommended for vehicle allowance for large group events and for group camping. Additional vehicles on site are typically for 24-hour periods and are utilizing parking spaces available to other day use park visitors, thus limiting parking and revenue the Department would receive from several vehicles utilizing a single spot while visiting that day.

Proposed Changes to Existing Fees

Two existing fees are being recommended for a description change to increase flexibility with operational issues running the Spring Lake Water Park. Currently, the Community Engagement Division runs three daily sessions of Water Park use - morning, mid-day, and afternoon. The fee for each of the three sessions is \$10.00. The Department recommends leaving the fee of \$10.00 for the morning and afternoon sessions for both adults and children to help encourage more people to use the Wibit when it is more available earlier and later in the day. The change would be in the description adding additional information on the sessions: Adult - per session, morning and afternoon sessions.

New fees are being recommended for the mid-session time slot detailed in the next paragraph.

New Proposed Fees

Water Park Mid-Day Use: As stated above the Department is recommending a new fee for the Water Park mid-day use for both adults and children. The recommended fee is \$12.00.

Summer Camp: The Community Engagement Division is recommending adding a new series of Recreation/Discovery/Environmental camps. The fee recommended for these camps is \$350 per session.

Justification for New Fees:

The new Water Park Mid-Day Use fee will encourage users to visit the Water Park during non-peak hours, lessening the burden of having larger crowds at mid-day which will help the Department with staffing

The Department currently offers a variety of Summer Camps primarily focused on aquatics. The recommended new camps would be recreation and environmental focused aimed at reaching a broader audience focusing on nature and educational programing. The courses will offer another camp option to the public looking for summer programs for their children.

Deletion of Fees

The Department is recommending the following fees be deleted due to them no longer being offered as a service.

- Youth Birthday Parties basic package and deluxe packages, additional children fees
- Group Camping, max 50 people
- Park Program Fees Tier 1 general and member, Tier 2 general and member, Tier 3 general and member and Tier 4 general and member
- Professional Development Seminars

<u>Justification for the Deletion of Fees</u>

The Youth Birthday party packages were developed as a fee item many years ago. The Community Engagement Division is focusing on providing educational classes and opportunities and recommends deleting these fees.

There is only one group site currently at Spring Lake with a maximum capacity of 75. The cost to set up and clean up remains the same and the Department recommends just one rate for the site for up to 75 people and removing the tier for up to 50 people.

Park Program Fees by Tiers program was developed many years ago and is no longer being offered. The program was replaced with a new sliding fee that was implemented in July 2011.

Professional Development seminars on Pest Management are no longer being offered by the Divisions.

Summary of Expected Results:

Fees are only being added to cover ongoing increases or the costs of providing staff services for programs, maintenance and care of facilities and events. While partial cost recovery is the key driver necessitating increases to park fees, Regional Parks seeks to ensure that its fees are not prohibitive to users even at the expense of cost recovery.

Recommended Action:

- A. Review and approval of a new fee for cold storage at Mason's Marina.
- B. Review and approval of the removal of obsolete fees and consolidation of fees at Spud Point and Mason's Marinas to help streamline operations.

Executive Summary:

Sonoma County manages 58 parks, trails, beaches, and other facilities, including three marinas. The marinas operate as enterprise funds separate from the primary Parks system funding, and fee revenue collected by the marinas is critical in their operations and maintenance of those facilities. Presently, due to the economic conditions and the delay of annual fishing seasons, the Department will not be recommending increases to marina fees this year.

This year, Regional Parks has completed a review of the marina's current approved fees. The Department recommends adding one new fee for cold storage. The review provided an opportunity to recommend removal and/or consolidation of many of the Marina's existing fees to help streamline operations as well. Details are included in the Fee Package Adjustment document and Resolution accompanying this report.

Discussion:

New Proposed Fees

The Department is recommending implementing a new fee of \$200 monthly for Cold Storage at Mason's Marina. Currently, Mason's Marina has a designated location with three electrical outlets to allow fisherman to park and store large, refrigerated trailers up to 20ft in length to be used for seafood storage.

Justification for New Fees:

Mason's Marina currently has the designated space and utility infrastructure in place for storage of three units. This service is a benefit to the local fishing community to be able to store items onsite and close to both Spud Point Marina and Mason's Marina. The Department, along with County Counsel, will develop a rental agreement outlining responsibility, liability, and costs upon approval of the recommended fee.

- 8. Mason's Other Fees Battery Core Charge
- 9. Mason's Retail Sales

Justification for the Deletion of Fees at Spud Point Marina

Currently, each type of specific seafood is listed (Rock Cod, Drag Boat Catch, Prawns, Albacore/Swordfish, Sea Urchin, Shark) for both permanent and transient vessels at a rate of \$.05 lb. The exception is for salmon and crab at \$.10 lb. There currently is a "All Other Species 5% of market value" fee. The Department recommends changing this fee to read "All Other Species", charging a rate of \$.05 and removing all the specific seafoods to streamline operations. The Department will continue to charge \$0.10 for crab and salmon which are the products most prevalent to the area.

The Department established a fee and practice for Boat Dealers to use Spud Point Marina to dock and show their boats for sale. The Department offered this service for a one-time boat show in the early 2000's and has not held an event since and requests to have this fee removed.

As with seafood, there is a specific fee for each oil and oil related product. There is currently a "Oil Margin, All Retail Products" fee with a set rate of "Cost + 40%-60% based on market." The Department recommends amending the fee to state "Cost + 35%" for all oil and oil related products and removing the specific named products. This change will improve operations by allowing the department to adjust product sales prices as prices fluctuate and not having to return with individual approved pricing based on a point in time.

Individual retail sales items are recommended for deletion and incorporated into the % markup based on market value at Spud Point. There are several clothing items listed, electrical plugs, and a duplicative "All Retail Products" fee the Department recommends removing. There is a current fee "Potential Retail Revenue for Items Sold" at a rate of Cost + 40%-60% based on market" used in conjunction with our retail seller's permit. The Department recommends changing the fee title to "Retail Sales" with a new rate of cost + 40%. This will improve operations by allowing the department to adjust product sales prices as prices fluctuate,

bring in new products and not having to return with individual approved pricing based on a point in time.

Lastly, the Workboat Rental for Spud Point is a duplicate fee already captured in an existing fee for Workboat Towing. The Department recommends removing this fee.

Justification for the Deletion of Fees at Spud Point Marina

The fees listed above for Mason's Marina are being recommended for deletion as they are no longer being offered by that location.

<u>Summary of Expected Results:</u>

The one new fee is expected to generate limited revenue, \$7,200 annually and is primarily in place to help commercial fishermen in need of cold storage on our property. There are no infrastructure improvements needed and the space is available for up to three trailers. The fee collected will cost recover the electricity being used.
